

Mansfield Motor Group Student Citizen Program Contest Rules and Requirements

CITIZEN PROGRAM: In an attempt to reward students for self-improvement, academic performance, and citizenship within the community, Mansfield Motor Group has created the Student Citizen Program to award one Richland County high school senior a Grand Prize of either a brand new car from Mansfield Motor Group or a \$10,000 scholarship.

ELIGIBILITY: Any student in their senior year of high school who attends a participating Richland County School and meets all of the criteria outlined below may be eligible to win. To be eligible each student:

- Must have a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or better for their senior year at the time of the final drawing, OR student must have improved their senior year GPA at least 1.25 points above their final cumulative GPA at the end of their junior year.
- Must return a completed copy of the attached application to the student's school by the entry deadline. This application must be signed by the student and the student's parent or legal guardian.
- Must not have any school detentions, suspensions, or non-excused absences during their senior year.
- Must not have been arrested or cited for any criminal activities in the past, including but not limited to moving violations, drug or alcohol activities, and seat-belt or texting violations.
- All criteria are retroactive to the first day of the 2013-2014 school year.
- Students of non-participating schools, foreign exchange students, and any student that failed to meet any of the above criteria do not qualify for any prize.

PROCESS:

1. Each student must fill out an application and have their parent or legal guardian sign it. The application must be filed with the student's school by the entry deadline.
2. Prior to the Mock Crash Event, each participating school will have a preliminary drawing of all eligible students to determine one finalist and one alternate finalist to attend the final drawing. Each finalist will be subject to a background check to determine if they are eligible to win the Grand Prize under these Rules. If the finalist is not determined to be eligible after the background check, the alternate shall take their place at the Mock Crash Event, subject to the alternate passing a background check.
3. Participating schools are responsible for monitoring and validating the eligibility of each finalist.
4. The Grand Prize drawing will be conducted at the Mock Crash Event scheduled for April, 2014.
5. At the Mock Crash Event, names will first be drawn out of a drum to determine the final drawing's order. In accordance with the order that their names were drawn, the finalists will then draw keys out of a drum. The finalist with the key that unlocks the displayed Nissan Versa Sedan is the winner. The Grand Prize winner will be subject to a second background check to verify eligibility.
6. Alternate prizes will be awarded to each of the other finalists.
7. The Grand Prize winning student must notify Mansfield Motor Group within 30 days of being chosen of their decision to elect the vehicle or the scholarship.
8. The student must fill out and sign a form W-9 at the time the car is chosen. A form 1099 will be issued for the vehicle with a value up to \$13,645.
9. Winning the Grand Prize will be subject to the Program Board verifying compliance with all rules after the drawing. If the student is found to have not met the required criteria then the second place student will be named the winner, and so on, until an eligible winner is chosen. After the Mock Crash Event, the Program Board will hold a drawing of the non-winning finalists to determine succession of the Grand Prize in case the winner fails to meet all of the necessary criteria. All winners are subject to passing a background check before being awarded the car or the scholarship.

PRIZES: The Grand Prize shall be the choice of a brand new Nissan Versa Sedan with an MSRP of \$13,645 OR a \$10,000 scholarship. If the student elects the vehicle, they shall choose between the Nissan Versa, or any other Mansfield Motor Group vehicle; if the student elects a different vehicle they shall be responsible for paying any amount over \$13,645, and Mansfield Motor Group will not pay any difference if the elected vehicle is priced under \$13,645. If student elects the vehicle, they will be responsible for any and all taxes required. If the student chooses the vehicle and is under the age of 18 at the time of election, then they must have their parent or legal guardian sign a "Minor Consent Form" in accordance with ORC 4505.031.

If the student elects the scholarship money, then all monies shall be paid directly to the student's chosen college, university, tech school, or other approved school, as determined by the Program Board. Scholarship funds will not be paid directly to the student. Scholarship funds will be limited to tuition, books, school-provided room and board, and required supplies; funds must be used within two years of the date of election of the scholarship or they will be forfeited.

PROGRAM BOARD: The Program Board shall consist of one representative from each participating school, and two representatives from Mansfield Motor Group. The Program Board reserves the right to use its discretion to interpret and enforce the rules set forth in this document.

Organizers of the contest reserve the right to make changes to the contest after it begins.
