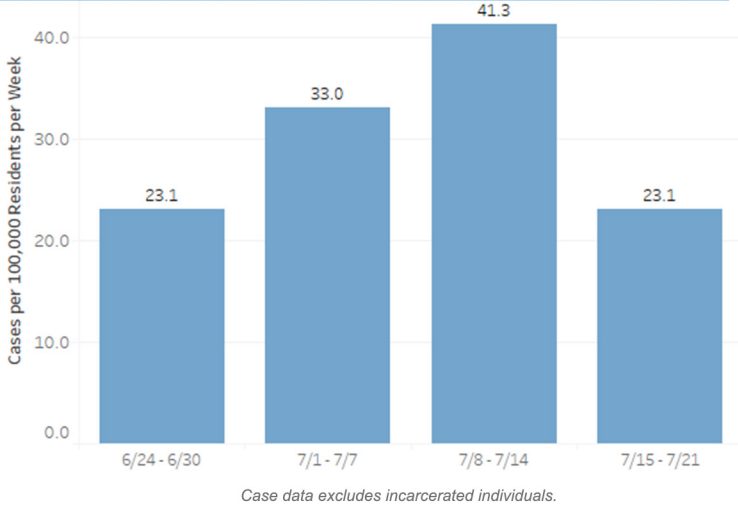

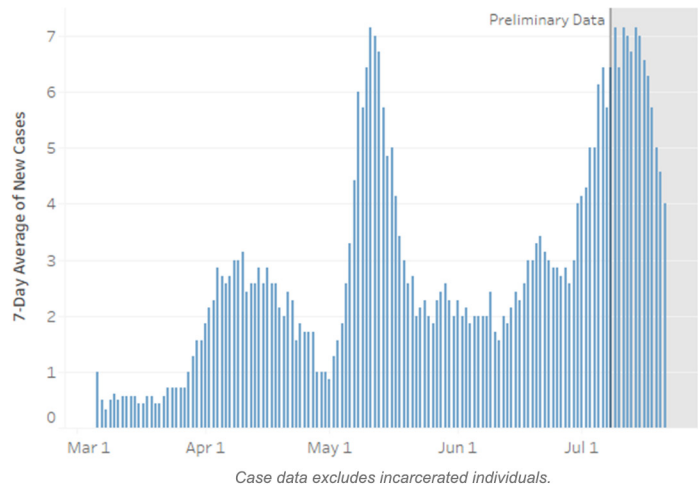

During the past 14 days, 78 COVID-19 cases have been identified in **Richland County**, representing approximately 19% of the county's total number of cases since the beginning of the pandemic. Since July 1, Richland County's COVID-19 average daily cases increased from four cases to seven cases by July 14. Due to clinical and reporting lags, these numbers may continue to grow for this reporting period. Richland County is also seeing an increase in the number of people seeking medical care due to COVID-19. From July 1 to July 13, visits for COVID-19 to the emergency department grew from an average of three visits per day to nearly six. More people are also visiting their doctors and being diagnosed with COVID-19. Between July 1 and July 13, average outpatient visits grew from 18 to 30 visits per day. In recent weeks, more than 88% of the cases were not in congregate settings, signaling significant transmission in the broader community. Outbreaks were traced back to informal gatherings and workplace and faith-based settings.

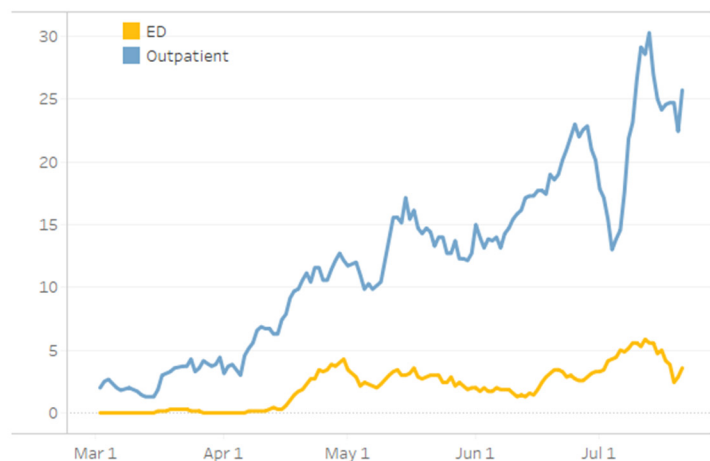
New Cases: Past 28 Days



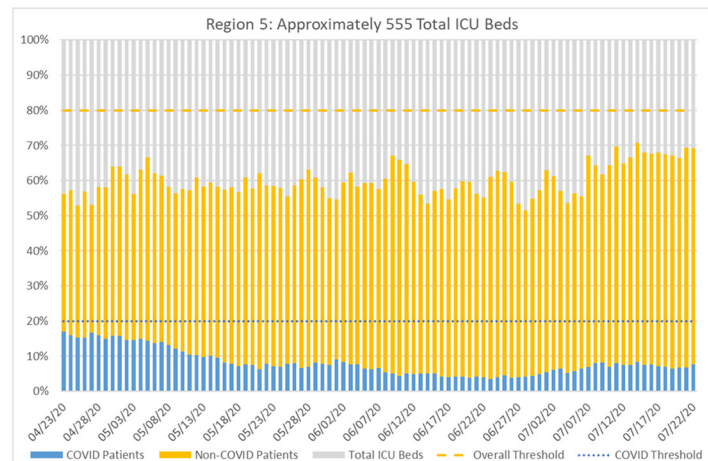
7-Day Average of New Cases
