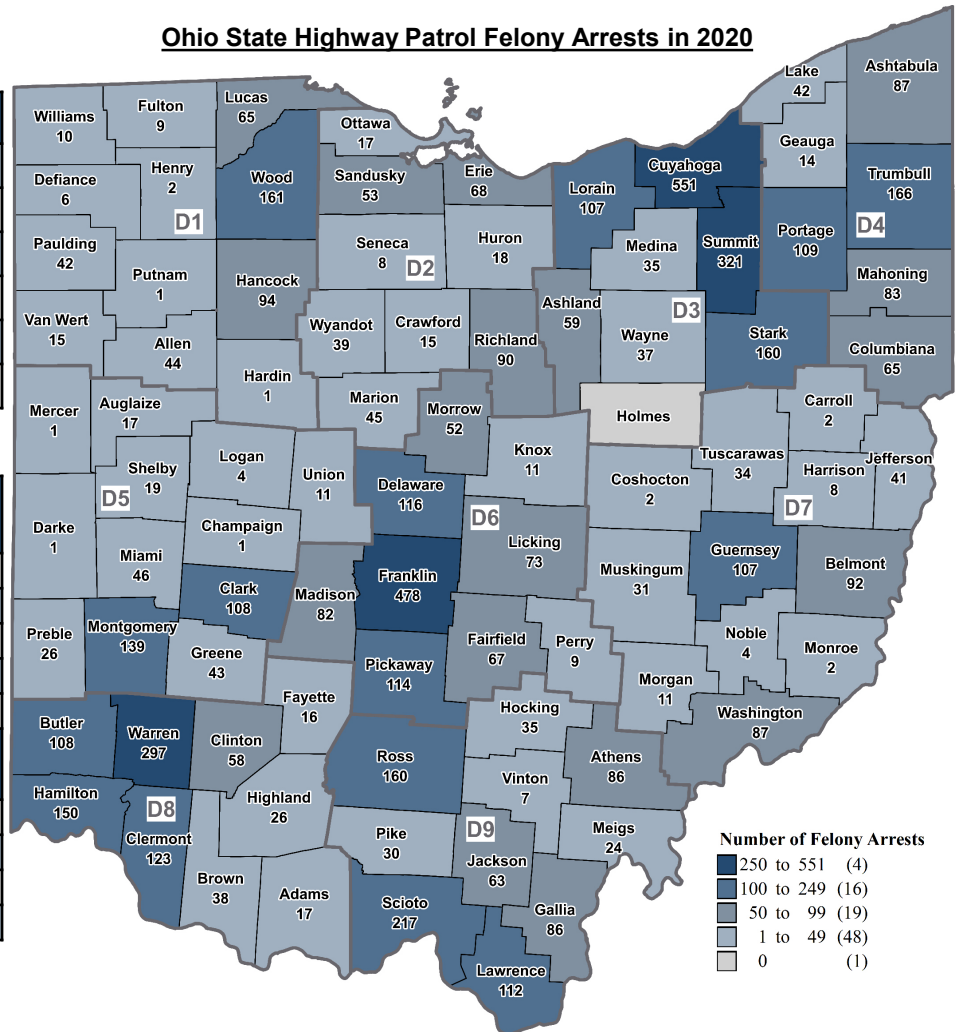

- OSHP Troopers made 6,133 felony arrests in 2020. This is essentially the same number of felony arrests as were made by Troopers in 2019 (-1%). Cuyahoga County led the state with 551 felony arrests. Other counties with large numbers of felony arrests include Franklin (478), Summit (321), and Warren (297). Together, these four counties accounted for more than one-in-four felony arrests in 2020.
- In 2020, OSHP Troopers recorded 1,228 incidents involving one or more illegal weapon violations, a 30% increase from the previous year. These incidents resulted in the removal of, among other weapons, 1,743 firearms from Ohio's roadways.
- OSHP also had success in 2020 in the recovery of stolen vehicles. Troopers recovered 1,471 stolen vehicles in 2019, a 23% increase from 2019 totals.
- In 2020, OSHP Troopers seized 6,162 pounds of marijuana on Ohio's roadways. This is more than double the amount taken in 2019 (+109%). Troopers also confiscated 225 pounds of methamphetamine (+87% from 2019) and 129 pounds of fentanyl (+35% from 2019) last year.
- OSHP Troopers also removed a large number of pills from Ohio roads in 2020. This includes 18,843 opiate pills (+2% from 2019), 9,202 depressant pills (+88% from 2019), 3,006 stimulant pills (+23% from 2019), and 1,692 hallucinogen pills (+4% from 2019).
