**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO**

SECTION 1. That Council, on behalf of the government and the citizens of the Mansfield community, is privileged to honor and pay tribute to Kim Hildreth upon her retirement from the City of Mansfield, effective March 31, 2026, after more than 30 years of dedicated public service.

Mrs. Hildreth’s career with the City of Mansfield has truly been remarkable. She began her career with the City on March 20, 1995, serving as a Program Coordinator with Litter Control. Ultimately, becoming a Project Planner in the Engineering Department.

Amending Chapter 935 – Sewer Use and Pretreatment Regulations of the Mansfield Codified Ordinances.

WHEREAS, the City of Mansfield operates a publicly owned treatment works (POTW) and an industrial pretreatment program pursuant to Chapter 6111 of the Ohio Revised Code and Ohio Administrative Code 3745-3-03; and

WHEREAS, the City periodically evaluates and updates local discharge limits to ensure protection of the wastewater treatment plant, compliance with the City's NPDES permit, and protection of receiving waters; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to maintain the specific numeric local limits on file with the Wastewater Treatment Plant and subject to approval by the Ohio EPA, rather than codifying those numeric values in the Mansfield Codified Ordinances.

WHEREAS, The numeric pollutant concentration table previously contained within Section 935.09(g), being hereby removed from the Codified Ordinances shall instead be maintained administratively by the City of Mansfield Wastewater Treatment Plant.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE
CITY OF MANSFIELD, STATE OF OHIO:**

SECTION 1. That Section 935.09, Supplementary Limitations of the Mansfield Codified Ordinances, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

“935.09 LIMITATIONS ON WASTEWATER STRENGTH.

(a) National Categorical Pretreatment Standards. National Categorical Pretreatment Standards found in 40CFR Chapter I, Subchapter N, Parts 405-471, shall be met by all applicable dischargers. An application for modification of the National Categorical Pretreatment Standards may be considered for submittal to the Regional Administrator by the City, when the City's wastewater treatment system achieves consistent removal of the pollutants as defined by 40 CFR 403.7.

(b) Categorical pretreatment standards for specific pollutants apply to all applicable dischargers. Each Categorical Industrial User must adhere to the most stringent limit for each pollutant; either from the local limit table in part (g) of this section, or the applicable National Categorical Pretreatment Standards. Final effluent limits for each Industrial User shall be finalized in their Industrial User Permit as detailed in Section 935.14 .

(c) State Requirements. State requirements and limitations on discharges to the POTW (local discharge limits) shall be met by all dischargers which are subject to such standards in any instance in which they are more stringent than federal requirements and limitations as those in this chapter or any other applicable ordinances.

(d) Right of Revision. The City reserves the right to amend this chapter to provide for more stringent limitations or requirements on dischargers to the POTW where deemed necessary to comply with the objectives set forth in Section 935.01.

(e) Dilution. No discharger shall increase the use of potable or process water in any way for the purpose of diluting a discharge as partial or complete substitute for adequate treatment to achieve compliance with the standards set forth in this chapter. This shall not prohibit the use of equalization tanks utilized to regulate flow.

(f) Best Management Practices (BMPs). The POTW may develop BMPs and such BMPs shall be considered local limits and pretreatment standards" as in OAC 3745-3-03(C)(4).

(g) Supplementary Limitations. ~~No discharger shall discharge wastewater containing concentrations ever exceeding the following enumerated materials:~~

No discharger shall discharge wastewater containing concentrations of pollutants exceeding the local discharge limits established by the City for the Mansfield Publicly Owned Treatment Works (POTW).

The local discharge limits for the Mansfield POTW shall be maintained on file with the City of Mansfield Wastewater Treatment Plant and shall be incorporated into Industrial User permits issued by the City.

Such limits shall be developed in accordance with Ohio Administrative Code 3745-3-03, and approved by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency as part of the City's Pretreatment Program.
